General Information

Neighborhood Services

Special Needs Recreation

North Riverside Recreation is not a member of a Special Recreation Association such as Gateway SRA. When a resident is able to participate in a program offered by an SRA, it is usually at a higher cost to them. North Riverside Recreation has established a policy in which the difference between the members fee versus the non-members fee will be reimbursed to the participant providing proper procedure is followed. Use of Commons Park

Use of the large and small pavilions in Commons Park is on a first-come, first-served basis. They cannot be reserved. Please remember that Village ordinances prohibit grilling and the use of alcohol in our parks.

Ball Field Reservations

Any resident or organization in North Riverside who wishes to reserve a ball field must come into the Recreation Office to fill out a request form. If the field is not in use, you will be issued a permit. First priority is given to Recreation teams and Little League. Visit www.northriverside-il.org for prices and to download the form.

Blood Pressure and Glucose Testing

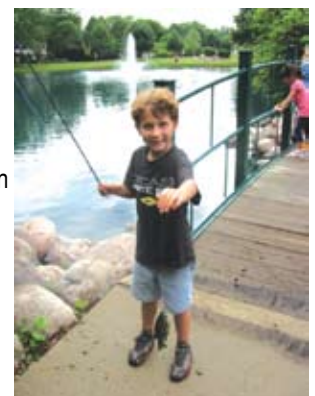

North Riverside Recreation Trip Policies

Tickets

In order to receive trip tickets, all information on the **Registration Form MUST be filled in, including the signature line!**

Keep tickets in a safe place...they are needed for trip participation! Tickets cannot be transferred. If a patron misplaces a ticket, he/she must board the bus last and be checked in by staff.

Selling of Tickets

If a ticket is sold to another person, the Rec Department must be informed immediately for insurance purposes.

That individual must either come into the office to sign a waiver or sign one before boarding the bus. If a ticket is sold to a non-resident, the resident is responsible for the difference due the Recreation Department.

Trip Refund Policy

In the past, we have been experiencing several last-minute refund requests for various day and evening trips. Although we realize that emergencies do arise, we need you to understand that we have confirmed contracts with vendors, thus the Village is NOT entitled to a refund. Because of these contracts, NO REFUNDS will be given for any trip unless there is a waiting list and a replacement for your ticket(s) can be found or you can find a replacement for your ticket(s). If this is the case, you must fill out a refund request form in person at the Recreation office. Your cooperation in this matter is appreciated. **Please allow 4-6 weeks for processing.**

Buses

For your comfort, we try to secure motorcoaches when possible. We generally use mini buses for short trips and family outings. Because of the lack of outside waiting facilities, we recommend that you do not come to the bus until ten (10) minutes before leave time. No one will be allowed to board the bus until a supervisor is present.

PLEASE NOTE: If you fail to return to the bus at the scheduled time you are responsible for your own transportation home.

Bus Seating

Bus seating is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Patrons should get in the bus line upon arriving at Village Commons. To accommodate everyone, we reserve the right to seat you on the bus. Seats cannot be saved. We ask that patrons sit in the same seat both to and from our destination. **Anyone requiring special assistance or accommodation MUST indicate their needs at registration.**

Waiting Lists

After a program has begun and the participant wishes to drop out of the class, the office must be notified within 48 hours of the first class meeting. A refund in the amount of 75% of the class fee, less supply costs, will be issued to the participant.
